# ClassDojo

At Parafield Gardens Primary School classroom teachers use ClassDojo to communicate and collaborate with families through messages, photos and videos. ClassDojo school is а communication platform that allows teachers, parents and school leaders to instantly message each other, without needing to share



phone numbers or contact details. ClassDojo also has the capacity to translate messages into 35 different languages making it a wonderful way to communicate with all families.

ClassDojo can be used on any device making it is easy to see what your children are learning at school and to be part of their classroom community. Simply accept the ClassDojo invite sent to you via email or mobile and begin sharing in your child's learning journey.

# 2024 Material & Service Charges

Parafield Gardens Primary School fees for 2024 (known as Material and Service Charges) are \$287 per student. We have quite a few options available to families for payment of school fees which will assist in managing household budgets.

**The School Card Scheme** is administered by the Department for Education and provides financial assistance towards school fees, supporting low to average income families. It is available for dependent students from 4 years of age receiving full-time schooling. Applicants are required to **apply each school year**, using the appropriate form which is available at the front office of the school or online at <u>www.sa.gov.au</u> under the heading Education, Skills and Learning.

Eligibility for School Card assistance is dependent upon the combined family income for the 2022-2023 financial year being within the School Card income limits (see chart below). As the school fees at Parafield Gardens Primary School are in line with the School Card amount, applicants will have no fees to pay once approved.

# **GOVERNING COUNCIL ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

1st February 2024

To all Parents/Caregivers

This letter is to inform all parents of Parafield Gardens Primary School that we will be electing new Governing Council members for 2024-2025 (2 year term) at our Annual General Meeting to be held in the Staffroom on Tuesday 13th February from 6:30pm to 7:30pm.

The Governing Council is a group of parents that have a joint responsibility with the Principal for the governance of the school. Some of the functions of the Governing Council are:

- set the broad direction and vision of the school.
- determine policies for the school including policies for the safety, welfare and discipline of students
- regular review of the school budget
- monitor and review the Site Improvement Plan
- maybe to raise money for school related purposes
- maybe perform other functions as determined by the Minister

# Under section 7.5 of the Governing Council constitution, all persons who are parents of the school are eligible to nominate for election as a councillor.

Unless the person:

(7.5.1) is an undischarged bankrupt or is receiving the benefit of a law for the relief of insolvent debtors; or

(7.5.2) has been convicted of any offence prescribed by administrative instruction.

The Department for Education now requires all Governing Council members to have a Department of Human Services Working With Children Screening clearance which will be organised by the school if need be. We are now calling for any nominations for election as councillors.

These nominations need to be made on the form included on the back page of this newsletter and sent into the Principal by **Friday February 9th 2023.** Application forms will also be available from the front office.

There will be a general meeting for the election at the **Annual General Meeting of Parents on Tuesday 13th February at 6:30pm.** Further information on the election of councillors will be given depending on the number of nominations.

Our Governing Council work with the school staff to make Parafield Gardens Primary School the best school it can be. If you would like to be involved and are prepared to work for the good of the school please consider nominating. You can nominate yourself or another person. I am happy to answer any questions that you may have.


