Dear Families,

Welcome back! We hope that you all had a nice break and found some time to relax and enjoy the beautiful sunshine. Hope you and your families are well and are feeling more of a sense of normality and back to regular routines!

We are very happy to say that the students in Reception had some great success last semester! After a challenging start, everyone has settled into their class routines, have developed friendships and have achieved some fantastic growth and progress. We are looking forward to another successful and exciting term ahead.

Parents/Caregivers will still not be permitted in the school classroom or corridor due to restrictions but this has positively impacted the children's organisation and independence skills. We understand that you may need to speak to your class teacher at times and we are more than happy to make an appointment before or after school or via email if you would like to discuss your child's progress, successes or any concerns you may have.

Attendance

It is very important that your child is on time each day to school at 8.35am, as some of our most important routines, English and Maths occur first thing in the morning. If you are late please ensure that your child has a late pass which is issued by the front office staff. An SMS will be sent to parents/caregivers if the school has not been notified *prior to 10:00am*.

Homework

To ensure that students are reinforcing ideas learnt during class time, students in the Early Years classes are required to practise their tricky words and read to a parent or caregiver **each night for 10 minutes**. Knowing these words will instantaneously help students' fluency in reading. Please practise sight words with your child regularly as part of your nightly homework routine. These sight words will be checked at the **beginning and end of each term**, as stated in the school literacy agreement. We also suggest parents spend **5 minutes** using the sound cards each night to practise their Jolly Phonics sounds. We understand your children may know their sounds but it is beneficial to still practise them for automaticity.

All students will now be swapping over levelled readers on **Monday, Wednesday and Friday**. This encourages them to develop their fluency. We will continue to use Running Records to test your child's reading. As they develop their comprehension, accuracy and fluency they will progress to the next reading level. You will be informed when they move up a level.

Routine and Communication

This term all routines and methods of communication will remain the same as in Term 2. This means your child will take home their diary, a reader, folder and tricky words each night. Please encourage your child to bring their communication folder, with these items, to school everyday.

Reading

As mentioned last term your child will be expected to read every night with you or an older sibling. The following ideas will be of support:

- encourage your child to have a go at guessing a word
- ask your child to look for clues such as a picture
- allow your children to pick up their own mistakes
- read the sentence and get your child to repeat the sentence

In your child's folder you will find the little booklet, we gave out in Term 2 which is full of words that can't be decoded called 'tricky words'. I ask that you read 3 words every night and give the word a tick once you think your

child knows it by sight. Remember these are tricky words and cannot be sounded out; they need to be learnt by sight this will help them with their reading. If they have finished the tricky words, they can begin accessing the sight words which can be found in the diary. They are decodable words and the children are allowed to sound them out. I will test your children twice a term and will practice the Tricky Words daily as a class.

Literacy Jolly Phonics

We will be continuing our work with the *Jolly Phonics* program throughout this term. To continue this learning all reception students will be working alongside each other in groups with similar ability and learning styles. Each child has undergone assessments to provide us with information to place your child in the group that best suits their individual needs, knowledge and understanding. There are 4 Jolly Phonics groups, so your child may be taught by Miss Bright, Mrs Tidswell, Mrs Hector or Miss Papahristos during these lessons. We believe that this approach will ensure that each child continues to learn at a faster rate. We are very excited about this program and can't wait to watch the students' learning growth.



Grammar

We will continue learning about grammar throughout the term, focusing on nouns, full stops and capital letters. This will be supported by the implementation of *Jolly Grammar*, which coincides with *Jolly Phonics*.

Guided Reading

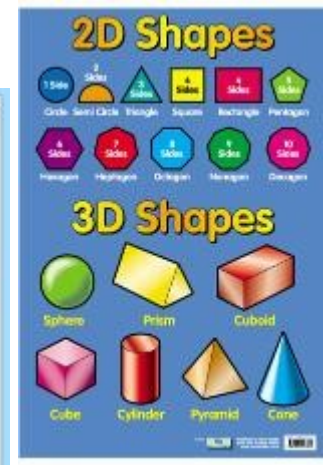
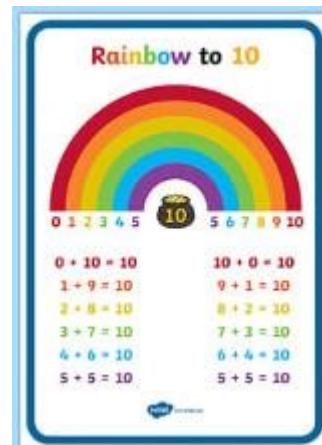
The students will begin guided reading which will be conducted in small groups. The groups will be organised according to their reading ability and students will be exposed to a variety of texts and activities.

Book Making

We will be continuing with our Book Making this term to develop our writing skills. In Book Making the children become authors of their own books. Book Making offers an authentic, purposeful writing experience. The children write both fiction and non-fiction (expert) books on topics that interest them. They apply their personal knowledge and skills to create incredible texts. They pay attention to details like title, author, text features and illustrations. They always keep in mind the audience and what makes a book interesting. It has been wonderful to see the children be incredibly engaged and motivated to be the best author they can be. They find inspiration from our favourite texts and authors as well as their own experiences.



Numeracy This term we will continue to focus on strategies and number. We will continue learning how to count forwards and backwards from 1-20, double numbers, rainbow facts (two numbers that add up to 10), near doubles and learning to add small quantities using concrete materials and two dice faces. We will focus on statistics and data for weeks 1-4, then shapes for weeks 5-10.



Investigative Play

This term for STEM the children will be involved in investigative play where they will be able to have the opportunity to engage in different Science (Physical Sciences), Mathematics and Technology activities in purposeful ways that allow them to reinforce and develop their learning. We will also have STEM challenges, which will support the development of the children's problem solving and team work skills. The children will also have the opportunity to be involved in learning through construction play, arts, craft, drama, music and a variety of other activities that connect to our curriculum areas.



Music and Drama with Georgia Yates

This term in music students will continue reading rhythms using ta and titi and also introduce a silent beat, za. They will use xylophones to play simple melodies and continue practising beat. Later in the term, they will participate in activities using this year's Music Count Us In song ready to perform as a whole school in Term 4.

In drama, students will participate in Process Drama, where the students become "superhelpers" to solve problems within drama scenarios

PE & Health with Josh Parsons

Term 3 will consist of Invasion Games/Sports. Invasion games are any activity which involves 2 or more teams with the objective being to invade the opponent's section of the field/court in order to score points. This includes sports such as Netball, Basketball, AFL, Handball, Soccer, Hockey, Rugby etc. Students will learn how to maintain possession of the ball and understand that you need to be in control of the ball in order to score.

In term 3, Reception students will identify and describe the different emotions people experience. They will be able to identify actions that help them be healthy, safe and physically active. They will be able to describe how their body responds to movement, identify settings where they can be active and demonstrate how to move and play safely.

AUSLAN with Christine Krohn

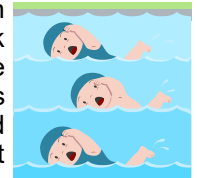
