

Typing Tutorials

5 minutes typing a day helps students memorise the keys on their keyboards freeing up their working memory for other things as they write. This is a great activity



The Sense-Lang site provides free typing lessons following a sequence that slowly involves all the keys on the keyboard. You are also given the ability to include your own text, which will add relevance and can also he used with spelling words
